Professorship (W3) for English Literature

The successful candidate is expected to cover the field of English Literature in both teaching and research. We are looking for a person with a research profile in at least two periods of English literary history (from 1500 to the present). They should be an expert in literary theory, bring experience in interdisciplinary collaboration, and have explored new approaches to connecting literary and cultural studies.

Applicants are expected to strengthen interdisciplinary connections, especially with the other literature departments of the faculty, and participate in both teacher training and BA/MA curricula, as well as in university committees.

Candidates should have PhD as well as 'habilitation' or its equivalent (second monograph). The professorship is also involved in teacher training; experience and concepts for teaching subject content in schools are welcome.

The designated salary for the position is based on the German university pay scale or equivalent. Goethe University is an equal opportunity employer, committed to diversity and inclusion. In particular, we are welcoming applications by qualified women and people with a migrant background. At Goethe University, a special emphasis is placed on creating and sustaining a family-friendly work and research environment. Where applicants are otherwise equally qualified, preference is given to candidates with disabilities or equivalent. The same applies to women in fields in which they are underrepresented.
