Professorship (W2) in Anatomy

The professorship is intended to strengthen research in the field of neuronal adaptation and home-ostasis. You will have a scientific focus on neuronal energy metabolism, mitochondrial function and organelle interaction and you will investigate these topics in the context of physiological and pathological neuronal adaptation processes. You will be expected to extend the methodological spectrum of Dr. Senckenberg Anatomy with modern molecular imaging methods at the organelle level, e.g. FRET, redox imaging, as well as calcium imaging. Teaching obligations are in German language, cover the full spectrum of anatomy for medical/dental students and require a strong enthusiasm. Additional experience in teaching in English language is advantageous. Furthermore, participation in the general responsibilities of the institute is obligatory, in particular taking over the responsibilities of a "Projekt-leiter Gentechnik". Integration into existing scientific foci of the Faculty of Medicine (neurosciences; oncology/immunology) is expected, as is a willingness to participate in existing or planned research networks of the Faculty of Medicine and Goethe University.

Prerequisites for application are a degree in human medicine or a biomedical oriented natural science, doctorate and habilitation or habilitation-equivalent achievements. You are expected to be scientifically visible, to have experience in leading a research group and to have successfully acquired third-party funding from the German Research Foundation (DFG).

The formal hiring requirements are defined in sections 67 and 68 of the Hessian Higher Education Act (Hessisches Hochschulgesetz).
