We're looking for student contributors to the *Adapting Lovecraft* website. *Adapting Lovecraft* is dedicated to medial adaptations of H.P. Lovecraft's fiction: we're interested in TV, film, music, podcast, videogames, analog games, and pretty much all other medial forms, and seek to establish an archive of work on the breadth of Lovecraft adaptation, **including in languages other than English**. Tied to *Medial Afterlives of H.P. Lovecraft: Comic, Film, TV, Podcast, Games* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2023), *Adapting Lovecraft* seeks to broaden the book's perspective from purely scholarly work to include more voices.

We're looking for a variety of forms of critical and/or experiential engagement with Lovecraft adaptations, including shorter and longer form textual work, and video and audio essays. Whether you want to critically analyze a particular object as a Lovecraft adaptation, do an interview with a creator or publisher, relate your experience playing a Lovecraft game, think through the ways in which Lovecraft relates to particular adaptations, or indeed approach the question of Lovecraft adaptation from a creative or otherwise non-academic angle: feel free to talk to us about your ideas. *Adapting Lovecraft* is meant to be a scholarly and popular resource, and a field of experimentation for engagements between the academy and popular audiences.
