Research Assistant (m/f/d) Post-Doc (E13 TV-GU, 70% part-time)

as of **01 July 2024**, initially for a fixed term of three years with the option of extension. The salary grade is based on the job characteristics of the collective agreement applicable to Goethe University (TV-G-U).

The post holder will be based at the Interdisciplinary Ageing Research Unit (IAW) as a Senior Researcher, specialising in cultural and social science ageing research. The profile of the department includes participation in teaching on the BA/MA degree programme in Educational Sciences, the acquisition and implementation of third-party funded projects, cooperation with academics in Germany and abroad and active participation in the Frankfurt Forum for Interdisciplinary Ageing Research (FFIA).

Responsibilities: The post holder should

- participate in the application for and organisation of third-party funded projects;
- present and publish scientific findings (also internationally);
- be involved in independent teaching at the department;
- be involved in student counselling and the supervision of theses;
- participate in the organisation and design of the department;
- utilise the opportunity for independent research.

Recruitment requirements:

The candidate is expected to have completed a doctorate in educational science (or close in content) with a cultural and/or social science connection to the topic of ageing, excellent knowledge of qualitative or quantitative research methods as well as experience in academic teaching and a very good command of English.
